Survey Results (as of 2/5)

Why did you volunteer?

- ✓ "Feels good to do good on this particular day."
- ✓ "Youth group wanted a service activity."
- ✓ "To model volunteerism for our children, to engage with people of different faiths, to make a difference in our community."
- ✓ "I have volunteered since this event began... love making this a meaningful day for me and my daughter - making the world a better place with like minded people."
- ✓ "To give back to the community. To show that multi faiths can work together for a common good."

Survey Results (as of 2/5)

Which aspects of your project were most satisfying?

- ✓ I enjoy building things and I really enjoyed teaching others how to use the tools and build the tables."
- ✓ "Seeing faces light up at the end when we gave out flowers!"
- ✓ "Knowing the soup would go into the hands of those who needed it very soon after it was made."
- ✓ "A chance to make something. A chance to make a difference on MLK's birthday. A chance to meet others & talk about their faiths."
- ✓ "Watching the young families get their hands dirty doing native plant habitat restoration. For many it was their first time, and I think the next generation of land stewards in County Parks has been kick started."

Survey Results (as of 2/5)

What can we do to improve for next year?

- ✓ "Please have more projects for kids under 10. Some of the ones with age limits of 10 or above sounded like my 8 year old daughter could have done them."
- ✓ "Better organization, so that volunteers don't end up standing around with nothing to do."
- ✓ "Have a separate line for drop-in sign-ups, not slowing down the registration for people (and families) already registered."
- ✓ "Make sure we have meaningful projects -- making bees didn't seem significant."
- ✓ "Need coffee."
- ✓ "Honestly, there were enough volunteers to have put together many more soup packets than supplies were available. We were done by 10:15am and everyone was disappointed we couldn't make more packets knowing that the need was much greater than what we put together, Next year, there should be a much higher goal for making soup packets (this year, total was 400 and we could have made at least double or triple that number in the time allotted.)"

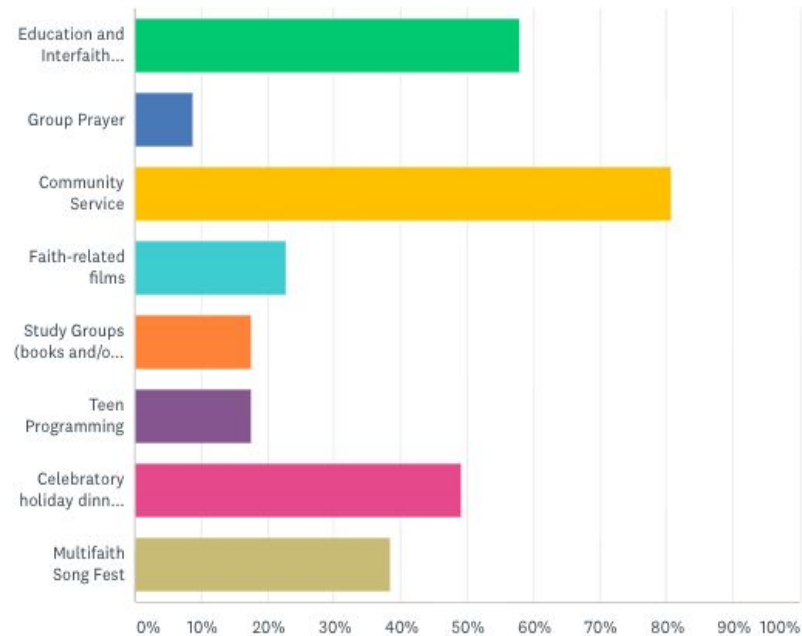
